Flex Your Power!

You can save energy, save money and protect our environment by practicing these energy-smart habits.

- Replace the four light bulbs you use most often with compact fluorescent lamps (CFLs) and save up to \$35 a year in energy costs.
- Turn off computers, TVs and stereo equipment when no one is using them.
- Avoid using major appliances like washers, dryers and dishwashers until after 7 p.m.
- Replace older appliances with energy-efficient, ENERGY STAR* models.
- Install a programmable thermostat and set it to 78 degrees on hot days and 68 degrees on cold days.
- Turn off lights in empty rooms. Take advantage of natural light whenever possible.
- Keep the refrigerator full to help it stay cool, while using less energy.
- Weatherize your home. Install energy-efficient windows, seal and caulk leaky doors and install foam gaskets behind outlet covers.
